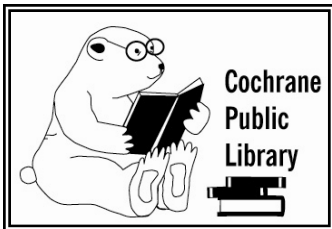

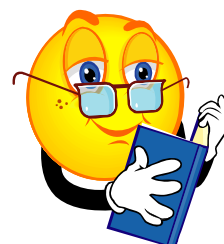

Knowledge Ontario

The Cochrane Public Library Board is pleased to introduce Resource Ontario, an online tool part of Knowledge Ontario which allows you to search for a variety of subjects such as: ancestry, career, academic, auto repair, etc. Knowledge Ontario is provincially funded to provide Ontario residents with a great opportunity to access new electronic information especially in small communities where learning resources sometimes are limited.

These databases supply the needs of young learners, as well as researchers at university level, and everyone in between.

Gale Cengage – contains nearly 30 databases including multidisciplinary general database, computer science, business, law, etc.

Career Cruising – to help you plan your future you can browse many careers' profiles, post-secondary schools, colleges, universities and other training opportunities.

Eureka – contains 20 years of archives, is a well known franco-phone resource available in text and PDF files.

Canadian Point of View – provide students with a series of essays on 100 key topics of interest of Canadian researchers.

Teen Health and Wellness – provides curricular support and self-help on subjects like diseases, drugs & alcohol, nutrition, mental and emotional health, cyber literacy, family life, sexuality and more.

Auto Repair Centre – automotive repair information on most manufacturers of domestic and imported vehicles.

Ancestry Library – for use in library only, it is a vast collection of approximately 4,000 genealogical databases, including key collections such as U.S. federal censuses from 1790 to 1930; census indexes from England and Wales from 1841 to 1901; civil registration of births, marriages and deaths for England, Wales, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man from 1837 to 1983, and more.
