Language Translation Mystery Challenge	Handout & Instruction Guide	The "Language Translation Mystery Challenge" is an activity that will promote the culture and language in your community. Patrons will be asked to solve the meaning of a sentence or word. The librarian will choose 7 statements or words in their community's language. This word/statement will be posted on the wall in the library. Patrons will be given a submission form to fill out. Patrons will be encouraged to use the resources available in the library to help them with the challenge.
Medicine Bag Activity	Handout & Instruction Guide	The "Medicine Bag Activity" is a guide to the creation of a medicine bag. It has suggested material and instructions based on the demonstration from the 2009 conference.
Promote Your Culture & Language – Draw a picture	On-line & Handout	Enclosed is a blank activity sheet titled, " <i>Celebrating Our Culture and Language</i> ". Photocopy this sheet and have your patrons help identify ways in which they can promote culture and language at the library.
